



MAJGEN BROADMEADOW ASSUMES COMMAND OF MCICOM

MajGen John J. Broadmeadow assumed command of Marine Corps Installations Command (MCICOM) from Brigadier General Thomas B. Weidley on 18 August, 2016 in a ceremony at Joint Base Ft Myer-Henderson Hall Arlington, VA. Besides his new post as MCICOM Commander, MajGen Broadmeadow will also serve as Assistant Deputy Commandant for Installations and Logistics (Facilities) and Commanding General, Marine Corps National Capital Region Command (MCNCR). Prior to joining MCICOM, MajGen Broadmeadow was Vice Director J4, Joint Staff. Before that assignment, he served as Commanding General, Marine Corps Logistics Command from 26 July 2013 to 12 May 2015.

“It is an honor and pleasure to assume command of MCICOM,” MajGen Broadmeadow said. “BGen Weidley performed exceptionally while serving simultaneously as Commander, MCICOM and the Commanding General, MCIEAST.”

He continued, “General Weidley held the course for MCICOM and I intend to ensure this Command remains a force multiplier for the Marine Corps.

We are directed by our leadership to find innovative and proactive means to accomplish our mission. As this Command has traditionally done, we will lead from the front and successfully execute our challenges.”

BGen Weidley is returning to Camp Lejeune, N.C. to continue serving as the Commanding General, Marine Corps Installations East.

MajGen Broadmeadow joins MCICOM with a distinguished career that began in July 1983 when he was commissioned a Second Lieutenant. As a General Officer, he was assigned as the Deputy Commanding General, Marine Forces Pacific in August 2009. He assumed Command of 1st Marine Logistics Group in June 2011 and deployed to Afghanistan in Feb 2012 for Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF) 12. Upon redeploying, in Dec 2012 he assumed the concurrent duty as Commanding General, 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade. He was promoted to Major General on 3 July 2013.

MajGen Broadmeadow is a graduate of the USMC Amphibious Warfare School and Command and Staff College (nonresident programs), a graduate of the U.S. Army War College in 2001. He holds a B.S. in Business Administration from Norwich University, a dual M.A. in Business Administration and Computer Resources Management from Webster University, and a M.S. in Strategic Studies from the U.S. Army War College.
